New Phone Box Defibrillator – Derwent Ane

We are delighted to tell you all that Annington Homes Project Manager Paul Guy has offered to, as a goodwill gesture, refurbish the existing telephone box on Derwent Avenue including donating and installing a defib machine free of charge. The defib machine will be donated as a goodwill gesture to Edith Weston Parish Council. Cathie has been in discussion with Paul and Community Heartbeat who supplied and maintain the current village defib and following a site meeting later this week we are hopefully that work should start in due course. We would like to thank Paul Guy and Annington Homes for their kind gesture.

St Georges Barracks Development

The extra time to respond to the Regulation 19 Local Plan is proving to be very helpful as more and more weaknesses are coming to light. We are informed that there have been a good number of responses so far and we still have 5 weeks left! There is lots of great work going on in the parish and liaison with our neighbouring villages too. The barrister is proving to be invaluable, not only in her professional responses, but also going above and beyond in sharing her expertise on how we can best impact and be effective; she is also visiting the village and driving around the area next week to gain further detailed insights.

The Parish Council are so grateful for all of those people who have sent a donation to them so far, without these donations, we really will not be able to see this through to the end, which leave us wide open to not being able to put up a very big fight and in the worst case, protecting the village from being completely engulfed! So far, we have been gifted £4,380 - which is 14.6 % of the target.
